This Sunday is a day that people have been anxiously awaiting. At 6:00 p.m. Eastern Time the Super Bowl will kick off in Indianapolis, Indiana between the New England Patriots and the New York Giants. The hype that surrounds this event every year is enormous, and at times overwhelming. It was a tradition, during my time at First Baptist Rowland, to have the youth group at the parsonage for a Super Bowl Party. I think we were more interested in watching the commercials than the game. It is amazing to think that companies are willing to pay approximately \$3.5 million for 30 seconds of airtime for commercials. With things like that happening in society it is no wonder that we seem to have skewed ideas about priorities. There are people who have been planning for weeks to gather around a television and watch the Super Bowl, planning what kind of food and drinks to serve. The question to ask ourselves is, "Where do we find ourselves in all of this hoopla?" How does the energy that is being expended compare to the effort that we give in other facets of our lives? If we could harness the frenzy that fills the air at Super Bowl time and put it toward serving Jesus Christ, much would be possible.

One Youth Group in South Carolina did just this. About 20 years ago they started something called, "**The Souper Bowl of Caring**," in which church members are encouraged to bring a can of soup, and a donation of at least \$1, with them to church on Super Bowl Sunday. The soup is collected and distributed to a local charity of the churches choice. Over the past several years it has grown to include over 1 Million congregations and groups across the country. They have helped to bring about a better understanding of how we can better direct our energies. The news is filled with people becoming overtaken by the frenzy of sporting events. Some years ago one father beat another father to death at their children's' hockey match. Why do people allow themselves to become so upset over a bad call at a sporting event, but show little energy concerning our involvement in the Body of Christ? It all comes down to getting out of something what you put into it. If we come to worship, and other activities, with excitement in our hearts, then we might possibly receive a blessing while there. What if we would plan all week about how we were going to approach each Sunday morning worship service? What if we were excited about many things the Lord is bringing about right before us? What if we just simply agreed to give Christ as much as we seek to give the rest of our lives? What if????? Peace, *Kenny*
